HELLO PARENTS,

Math is part of our everyday lives. It is an important skill that helps children develop critical thinking, solve problems, and plays a significant role in later education. Math is not only counting and naming shapes. It is also measuring, noticing patterns, making comparisons, and describing the environment. In this newsletter, we provide you with simple math activities that you can do with your child to encourage learning in a fun way.

ACTIVITIES

INFANTS (3-18 MONTHS)

Spatial Relationships

MATERIALS:

- · Balls, soft toys, baby socks etc.
- · Bubbles

DIRECTIONS:

- Throw balls or soft toys and let the baby hold it and throw it back at you.
- Blow bubbles at your infant and count the bubbles as the baby looks at them.

TODDLERS (19 MONTHS - 2.5 YEARS)

Sorting activity

MATERIALS:

- Ice tray
- · Buttons, dice, rocks or alphabet letters sorted into small bowls
- · Water

DIRECTIONS

- $\cdot\;$ Group materials of the same colour in separate bowls.
- · Have your child explore the materials and watch what she is doing.
- · Count the items with your child.
- · Name colours.
- To make the activity more fun, after sorting, fill the ice tray with water while the objects are in the tray and freeze it for the child later to play with ice cubes.

PRESCHOOLERS (2.5 - 5 YEARS)

Match Numbered Cars to the Parking Lot Spaces:

MATERIALS:

- Toy cars
- · Paper and pen
- · Tape

DIRECTIONS:

- · On the paper, draw parking spots and label them like 1,2,3 etc.
- Cut the paper into small rectangle pieces and write on each piece a number like 1,2,3 etc. Tape the pieces to each car.
- Have your child match the cars to the right parking spots on the paper.

JK/SK (4 – 6 YEARS)

Shape recognition

MATERIALS:

- Papers and pen
- Colour pencils

DIRECTIONS:

- \cdot $\,$ Draw on the papers different shapes and let your child colour them.
- After done colouring, go over the shapes with your child, and give more information for example "This is a triangle it has three corners".

- $\cdot \hspace{0.1in}$ Have your child do the problems , this is a good daily practise.
- · You can do adding one day and subtracting the following day.
